

About the WSO In 1969, a group of musicians at Cartrefle College in Wrexham got together to form the Clywedog String Ensemble. Little did they realise that some 50 years later, the Ensemble would be a full complement Symphony Orchestra of some 60 or so members, performing extraordinary works to exacting standards. It has been a truly remarkable journey and today, Wrexham Symphony Orchestra is one of the most progressive orchestras in the North Wales and North West England area, and regularly attracts professional conductors and outstanding soloists.

We perform our concerts in Wrexham's premier performance arts venue, the William Aston Hall at Wrexham Glyndŵr University, with whom we have a close and strong relationship. We rehearse, normally in the Hall, on Wednesday evenings, from 7.15pm to 9.30pm, and usually on the final Friday evening and the day of the concert. Vacancies for new players are often limited, but we are always keen to hear from good musicians of all ages, including schoolchildren and students. 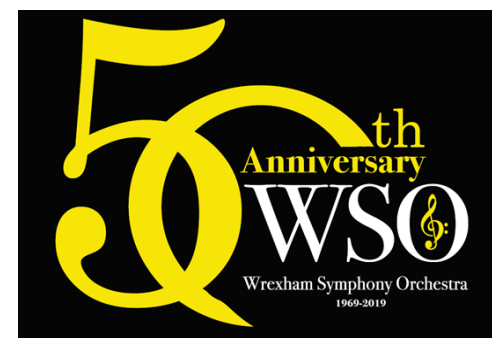
