Another concert season draws to a close as we welcome back to the podium popular conductor Richard Howarth, in a programme that includes works by Gershwin, Sibelius and Saint-Saëns, 'Rondo Capriccioso', which will be played by our guest soloist Lily Whitehurst, whose performance at our recent Proms in the Park concert was outstanding, receiving a well-deserved prolonged ovation from the large audience. You can read more about the Proms concert below. Tonight's programme also includes a world premiere of a new composition, 'Arenig', by young composer and orchestra member, Louie McIver. We have had a busy season with 5 concerts and we have been greatly encouraged to see more people coming to our performances. As we look forward, we have a couple of exciting concert seasons ahead with a number of special concerts. We shall be supporting the 50th anniversary of the Wrexham Hospital League of Friends in our first concert on November 5th (we can expect some fireworks perhaps!) and this is quickly followed by our joint gala concert with Glyndwr University in February 2018 when we celebrate two special events. We will commemorate 10 years since the University gained its independent status and our 20 years as the Orchestra in Residence. An additional concert in May 2018 will see us perform Mahler's 9th Symphony as part of our ongoing Mahler Charitable Concert Series when we seek to heighten awareness about the impact that Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia have on individuals, their families and communities, raising funds in support of the work of Wrexham Memory Clinic. Thank you for supporting us throughout our 48th concert season and we now invite you to sit back and enjoy this evening's wonderful concert. Have an enjoyable summer and we look forward to welcoming you back to our 49th concert season in the autumn – please do share news about us and our concerts with your friends and family, encouraging them to come along to a concert and help us grow our audiences.

The Orchestra's performance at the Proms in the Park concert held on Saturday June 10th at the British Ironworks Centre received wide acclaim. Clive Knowles, founder and Chairman of the British Ironwork Centre was thrilled with their inaugural Proms in the Park event and said "A fabulous Proms in the Park concert. You really smashed it and you should all be personally very proud. Thank you for the huge contribution by the members of the Wrexham Symphony Orchestra, the Clwyd Clippers and especially Lily Whitehurst – you were all truly outstanding".

The Proms concert was a new venture for the British Ironwork Centre and their initiative was well supported by a large audience, despite the disappointing weather during the afternoon. However, the sun shone through around 7pm and the evening was bathed in lovely sunshine. Clwyd Clippers got the Proms off to a great start with their popular brand of harmony singing before returning to perform a second set of songs and also leading the singing of the Proms favourites towards the end of the evening.

The Orchestra's programme was a combination of popular and favourite classical pieces and music from blockbuster films which included a wonderful performance of the main theme from Schindler's List by Lily Whitehurst which received a well-deserved standing ovation. Other film music performed by the Orchestra included the theme tunes from Thunderbirds, Jaws and Raiders of the Lost Ark.

Sophia Knowles, Operations Director at the Ironwork Centre, commented "Tonight was sensational; we are already planning next year's Proms! It was wonderful to see a stiff upper lip attitude following driving rain all of Saturday morning and afternoon, the guests' resilience paid off as the sky cleared shortly after the start. A sense of patriotism was prevalent throughout the event, particularly when flags were waved in time to the music which varied from classic movie soundtracks to the National Anthems".

The final Proms session started when Darth Vader, complete with light sabre, landed on the podium and took over the conducting role for the Imperial March and Throne Room from Star Wars. On the conclusion of the Proms songs and the National Anthems, a spectacular firework display lit the Oswestry night sky in time to the First movement from Star Wars.



Conductor, Richard Howarth posted about the Proms concert experience, "Congratulations to Wrexham Symphony Orchestra and thanks to all those too numerous to mention who helped organise last night's concert at the British Ironwork Centre. We had a great evening. The orchestra excelled, Lily Whitehurst played her violin beautifully and I got to be Darth Vader.". Orchestra Leader Mark Lansom spoke glowingly about the Proms experience 'Thanks to everyone who made last night such a success. The Orchestra for keeping their spirits up despite rehearsing all afternoon in pouring rain and an audience who turned up, even though they knew how wet they might get. A preview of our 49th Season... coming up soon

Our 49th concert season starts with a bang on Sunday November 5th when Mark Lansom will conduct the orchestra in a family afternoon concert programme featuring music from popular family films including 2001 Space Odyssey, Fantasia, ET and Back to the Future. This concert will support the work of the Wrexham Hospital League of Friends who are celebrating their 50th anniversary in 2019.

We welcome Russell Gray to the conductor's podium for two concerts in January and February 2018. On Sunday January 14th 2018 we invite you to join us in another family concert, 'An Afternoon at the Ballet'. We have some real treats in store and the programme will feature music from Swan Lake, Nutcracker and Sleeping Beauty. We are encouraging children of all ages to dress up in their favourite character costumes for this special New Year family concert.

We have a special Gala Celebration Concert with Glyndwr University on Saturday 24th February 2018 - 'A Night at the Opera' with our special guests North Wales Opera Studio, who will perform staged scenes from a number of popular operas including La Boehme, Carmen, Madam Butterfly and La Traviata. We join with the University to mark 20 years as the Orchestra in Residence and 10 years since Glyndwr was granted University status. This will be an extra special night and a highlight of our 49th concert season. So book the date and be here for that concert.

On Saturday May 19th 2018 we continue with our Mahler Charitable Concert Series performing Mahler's Symphony No 9 with the valuable support of Betrinac, and raising funds for the work of the Wrexham Memory Clinic who support those in our communities affected by Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia. Popular conductor Richard Howarth will return to conduct this concert.

Our 49th season draws to a close on July 14th 2018 with a delightful programme of music by Tchaikovsky, Liadov and Dvorak. Nic Fallowfield returns to conduct the orchestra and introduce us to international violinist and chamber musician Fenella Humphreys, whose credits include performances for the BBC and Classic FM.

We are in for a wonderful 49th season of all that is best in classical and popular contemporary music with something for the whole family. Our 50th season is just around the corner and we are planning some very special concerts including another 'Proms in the Park' concert at the British Ironwork Centre in September 2018, which will be the launch pad for an exciting new concert season.
